Looking Forward by Looking Back: Clashes, Revolutions, and the <u>Future of World Civilizations</u>

2017 is the centennial of two world-changing events: America's entry into the Great War and the Russian revolutions. In 2017, AIA will present a series of public lectures at the UNM Continuing Education Building in three "clusters." The first will concentrate on the U.S. global role since WWI until present and especially its relations with the Middle East and East Asia. Another "cluster" will focus on Russia, the impact of its revolution both at home and abroad, giving special attention to the Baltic region, Transcaucasia and Central Asia. The third "cluster" will start examining the roots of Middle Eastern conflicts and their influence on the wider Muslim world. In 2017, we will concentrate on Turkey, emerging from the ruins of the Ottoman Empire, and Iraq.

In addition to the International Lecture Series, CFIS-AIA will present a wide variety of cultural programs, specifically <u>AIA @ the Albuquerque Museum</u>: lectures on art, architecture, world literatures and cultures around the world. Lectures will take place at the Albuquerque Museum auditorium (AM) every 2nd Sunday of the month (except for December).
